**Professor David J. Cooper – University of Alberta (CA):**

David Cooper joined the University of Alberta in 1989, and became the first holder of the Certified General Accountants of Alberta Chair in Accounting (1995 - 2011). David obtained a BSc (Econ, honours) from the London School of Economics and his PhD from the University of Manchester in 1980. Previously he held academic positions at Manchester, UMIST, East Anglia UBC and University of Oxford, and is currently an Honorary Professor at Cardiff Professor and Consulting Professor at Strathclyde University. David was awarded the Haim Falk Award for distinguished contribution to accounting thought in 2005, the Killam Annual Professorship in 2008, the Kaplan Prize in 2010, and has received 2 Honorary Doctorates.

David has written or edited eight books and over seventy five articles and book chapters. His research has examined the development and implementation of business planning and performance measurement systems in government organizations and multinational organizations, and their impact on managerial practices. He has also conducted research on the management of large professional service firms (notably law and accounting), with special emphasis on processes of change, ethics and globalization.

He is an editor of Accounting, Organizations and Society and is a member of the Editorial Boards of seven other international research journals. He has taught senior managers in a variety of programs in Canada, the US and Europe, and has consulted with public and private sector organizations on strategy, performance management and costing.

**Professor Peter Miller – London School of Economics and Political Science (UK):**

Peter Miller is Professor of Management Accounting at the London School of Economics and Political Science, Head of the Department of Accounting, and Deputy Director of the Centre for Analysis of Risk and Regulation. Prior to joining LSE, he was a Lecturer in Accounting at the University of Sheffield. He has been an Associate Editor of Accounting, Organizations and Society since 1988. He has published more than 50 articles in accounting and management journals such as Accounting, Organizations and Society, the European Accounting Review, the Journal of Accounting Research, Management Accounting Research, and the Academy of Management Review, as well as in a range of other social science journals such as Economy and Society, the British Journal of Sociology, Theory, Culture and Society, Theory and Society, Sociology, Cultural Values, and Social Research. He has also published four books, including Accounting as Social and Institutional Practice (co-edited with Anthony Hopwood, Cambridge University Press, 1994). His current research interests focus on investment appraisal practices for large-scale complex investments, and performance assessment and 'new public management'. He has conducted extensive field work in a range of major corporations such as Caterpillar and Intel, as well as in various public sector organizations.

Professor Miller is a World-leading scholar in the sociology of accounting. He has pioneered a stream of research orientated to understanding ‘small management technologies’ such as accounting through organizational and sociological lenses. Having pointed out that what counts of accounting varies across space and time, he has undertaken empirical analyses e.g. of capital budgeting practices, relations between accounting and manufacturing spaces, the role of Road Maps in coordination investments across firms, the hybridization between professional and accounting practices in public sector institutions. Together, these accumulate to theory about the relationships between accounting, organizing and economizing.
